Player Disqualification FAQ

Q) I have been disqualified. Can I appeal this ruling?

A) The Head Judge's ruling is final and is not subject to appeal. Appropriate statements will be reviewed by the Tournament Organizer and Fantasy Flight Games. Additional action, including a suspension from play at the Organizer's events or from all FFG events is possible.

Q) What can I do?

A) Write down what happened from your perspective. This is called a statement, and is your opportunity to explain your understanding of what happened. The statement will be provided to the Tournament Organizer and Fantasy Flight Games. A statement should include your name, contact email, SWU ID, and event information.

Q) Do I have to write the statement now?

A) No. You can submit your statement within the next week to the Tournament Organizer, or after that to Unlimited@FantasyFlightGames.com. However, it is recommended that you write your statement as soon as you are able, as your recollection of details may diminish. If you plan to write your statement later, it is recommended that you let a judge or the Tournament Organizer know.

Q) Am I still eligible for prizes?

A) Any prizes or product you have already received are yours, but you will not receive any additional prizes for this event.

Q) Can I play in other *Star Wars*™: Unlimited or other Fantasy Flight Games events? A) Until you hear otherwise, yes. This incident will be investigated by Fantasy Flight Games, and you will be informed if you are suspended from sanctioned play. The Tournament Organizer may independently suspend you from playing in their events.

Q) What are my options if I believe the disqualification was incorrect or mishandled?

A) Include your perspective and concerns in your statement. If you have concerns about the judge's or Tournament Organizer's behavior, you can include that in a direct statement to Unlimited@FantasyFlightGames.com.
